riches, we should rejoice that God has placed us in the midst of such a glorious world. Therefore, when we see this glory diminished by our sin, greed and foolishness, we should be horrified and speak out against this want on destruction of the wonder that God has created. We should both repent and seek to do all in our power to protect all that God has created.

In the light of this, our faith, we call upon all Christians, but especially those of our tradition, to protect the gifts of God in nature. In particular, in this time of deep crisis of creation, caused by human folly and sin, we ask all Christians to protect and defend our most endangered species in Africa, such as the rhinoceros, gorillas and the elephant.

As Christians we can defend these fellow creations of God through preventing poaching, refusing to participate in any illegal trade and in bringing to justice, both human and divine, those who seek to destroy that which we know God loves.

I pray that this finds you in good health. I write this from the heart of Africa which is indeed the Pearl of Africa – Uganda; in the Anglican Diocese of Bunyoro-Kitara.

We must do all in our powers to save mother nature in all its components.

I pray that you will lend all in your powers to make this possible. God bless you.
